**Brandi Swindell** has been a vital force in building a culture of life and currently lives in her hometown of Boise, Idaho. Through her dedication to build a culture of life she has been active in leading and organizing many life-affirming events –locally, nationally, including Washington DC, and internationally.

In 1999 Brandi Swindell co-founded Generation Life to mobilize the post Roe generation. Generation Life is a grassroots movement of activists, students, artists, musicians, young adults and professionals committed to ending abortion and spreading the message of sexual integrity.

As a woman from the post-Roe generation and a young leader in the pro-life movement, she carries a particularly important message. She represents the new face of pro-life America... young, passionate, and articulate, going into the public square to build a culture of life for the next generation. Brandi is a nationally known speaker and is frequently requested for media interviews.

**The work and public ministry of Brandi has been featured on:** The BBC, The O'Reilly Factor, The New York Times, CNN, C-SPAN, The Washington Post, Boston Globe, Newsweek, Los Angeles Times, TIME Magazine, MSNBC, Scarborough Country, Fox and Friends, The Associated Press, and NPR. Brandi was also featured in "Portraits of Idaho," an annual publication of the Idaho Press-Tribune, selected as one of "Idaho's Top Ten Movers and Shakers" in THRIVE Magazine and named "A Rising Star in the Pro-Life Movement" by the Idaho Statesman.

**Some of her work and projects include:**

- Founder and president of Stanton Healthcare, a life-affirming medical clinic.
- Co-founded Keep the Commandments Coalition which led the first ever voter initiative to return the Ten Commandments monument to Julia Davis Park.
- Featured speaker at international pro-life conferences in Ireland and Australia.
- At the age of 28, Brandi ran for public office in her home state. This inspired and motivated her generation to engage in public affairs.
- Organized and led pro-life and sexual integrity witness during the 2002 Salt Lake City Winter

Olympics that stopped the distribution of flavored condoms by The Red Cross and Planned Parenthood.

- Organized peaceful demonstrations and prayer vigils for Terri Schindler Schiavo. She also went on a 15-day hunger strike to stand in solidarity with Terri Schindler Schiavo.
- Worked to allow prayer for Elian Gonzalez on a public sidewalk in front of Cuban Interest Section. Won a lawsuit to allow prayer on public sidewalk for prayer time.
- Lobbied at the United Nation's Headquarters for pro-life and pro- family issues (to prevent pressured abortion in third world countries).
- In the days leading up to the Summer 2008 Olympics in Beijing, China, Brandi led the first ever public memorial in Tiananmen Square to honor the victims of the 1989 massacre. She also led a prayer vigil for those persecuted by the Chinese government for their religious and pro-life beliefs through its one-child forced abortion policy. Brandi and two other Americans were arrested, detained, and finally deported for publicly speaking out against China's human rights violations.



**Patrick J. Mahoney** is a nationally known Christian social and political activist, and an ordained minister in the Reformed Presbyterian Church. Reverend Mahoney works in Washington, DC and resides in Fredericksburg, Virginia, with his wife Katie. They have three daughters: Tara, Kaitlin, and Dillon along with two grandsons.

Rev. Mahoney grew up on the Jersey Shore, in Ocean Township, New Jersey. He attended the University of Dayton, OH and Faith School of Theology in Maine where he graduated in 1976. He served from 1977-78 as Youth Pastor at El Bethel Church in New York City, where he received his first experience working with troubled youth and gang members. From 1978 to 1981 he was part of the Pastoral staff of New Covenant Presbyterian Church in Pompano Beach, Florida where he was ordained as minister at large. Here he began a social service program that strove to meet the needs of the surrounding community, which still continues today.

In 1981 Rev. Mahoney moved to Connecticut to establish New

Covenant Church and served there as Pastor until 1987. From 1987 until 1991 he was the Director of the Center for Christian Activism, based in South Florida. The Center was active in challenging the Church to establish Biblical principles in a hurt and fragmented world. Rev. Mahoney has worked extensively on pro-life causes, homelessness, hunger, racism and other pressing issues of social justice from a Christ-centered biblical perspective.

In September of 1992 the Mahoney family moved to the Washington, DC area to assume a position as Director of the Joshua Project and Christian Defense Coalition. This is a national ministry committed to challenging the Body of Christ to live out their faith in the public square.

For over 30 years Rev. Mahoney has been an outspoken advocate for the struggling and oppressed in our society. He has criss-crossed this country, speaking out with deep passion and conviction on broad issues of social justice.

Some of his activities have included: sleeping in a newspaper dumpster in New England to draw attention to the plight of the homeless; establishing and operating of soup kitchens, food pantries and emergency shelters for the needy; and assisting in the development of a program to ship medical supplies to war torn Central America. He was the first American to walk the Dublin to Belfast road for

peace in Ireland and helped rebuild border roads with Northern Irish farmers.

Rev. Mahoney is a founder, and also serves on the Executive Board, of the Alliance for Revival and Reformation. This organization is made up of nationally known pastors, historians, theologians and pastors who are dedicated to spreading the message of repentance, biblical revival and cultural reformation. He speaks in churches on a regular basis concerning these topics.

Rev. Mahoney is also a Founding Board Member of The Fredericksburg Christian Health Center which is a medical clinic outside of Washington, D.C. reaching out to the poor and needy of the Fredericksburg, Virginia community. Since its founding, the center has served over 60,000 indigent patients.

His work has been featured in the national media through such publications as Newsweek, Time, New York Times, Washington Post, LA Times, & U.S. News and World Report. Reverend Mahoney has been seen on O'Riley Factor, Good Morning America, Larry King, Oprah, ABC Hannity, Fox and Friends, Fox News, the BBC, CBS News, NBC News, CNN, 48 Hours, 20/20 and the 700 Club.

Rev. Mahoney currently serves on the Board of Directors for Stanton Healthcare.
